



Free Legal Services in Minnesota for DACA—2017

On Tuesday, September 5, 2017, the Trump Administration announced that DACA (Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals) would be ending. Below are free legal services in Minnesota to help eligible current DACA holders renew their DACA permission/work authorization by the October 5, 2017 deadline and to help with other DACA-related issues.

Volunteer Lawyers Network

1. DACA Service Provided: Advice and service provided on-the-spot, self-help (*pro se*). No ongoing legal representation provided.
