Making a Lasting Impact

2016 Immigrant Law Center Pro Bono Partner of the Year

In 2015, VLN partnered with ILCM to establish the Family Unity Self-Help Clinic as a response to the tremendous demand for assistance with family reunification for immigrants and refugees. The clinic provides brief legal counsel for low-income immigrant and refugee families seeking the legal assistance necessary to reunite spouses, children, and parents across borders.



The Minnesota State Bar Association Bernard P. Becker Legacy of Excellence is presented each year to four individuals who have demonstrated a commitment to providing skilled and zealous legal representation and advocacy to low-income Minnesotans. During her 14-year tenure at VLN, Delaney Russell has established the popular Family Law Clinic at the Hennepin County Family Justice Center; improved VLN's service delivery model by creating high-quality attorney education programs, including the widely popular Breaking Poverty Barriers training; and improved the way VLN measures client outcomes. She has a national presence in the area of pro bono service delivery and she works to collaborate with client groups.

Park Avenue Legal Clinic

Twenty years ago, Volunteer Lawyers Network partnered with Park Avenue Church to start the Park Avenue Legal Clinic, one of several on-site community legal clinics run by VLN to provide brief advice, service, and referral in civil law matters. One of the longest-running and best-established projects of its kind in the Twin Cities, other legal services, government agencies, social service organizations, community members and others rely on the Clinic as a referral for clients to obtain on-the-spot access to competent legal advice and service.

Located in South Minneapolis, the Park Avenue Legal Clinic has served pro bono clients since 1997.

Committed volunteer lawyers play a key role in the Clinic's success, and since 1997 have helped over 8,000 low-income community members navigate the legal system. Colleen Beebe Purisaca (pictured below), now a program manager and resource attorney for VLN's Immigrant Legal Services Program, is an original founder of the Clinic. As a volunteer, she helped start the Clinic right after she graduated from law school.

Over the years, the Clinic has become a safe place to refer clients with immigration questions, and many of the volunteers staffing the clinic are immigration lawyers. In the current climate of uncertainty and fear, the Clinic's services are needed more than ever to ensure easy access to reliable legal information and help from caring and trustworthy lawyers.

Helping Francisco Gain Citizenship

Years ago, Francisco Marquez, a Mexican citizen, fell in love with a U.S. citizen. When they married, Francisco legally immigrated to the U.S.A. to be with his new wife. The couple had a child who is now an adolescent.

A few years ago, Francisco visited the Park Avenue Legal Clinic to take the next step in his immigration journey and apply for U.S. citizenship. He did not fully understand the process – any immigration process can be very intimidating and confusing – and he needed some help to get started. Over the course of several months he visited the legal clinic with different questions. Volunteer lawyers answered his questions and encouraged him to apply for citizenship – he was ready!

Time passed, and then one day Francisco appeared at the Clinic with a beautiful cake in hand – he wanted to celebrate because he had just been sworn in as a U.S. citizen. "I couldn't have done this without the Clinic's help," he said, "I don't have a lot of family in the U.S., so I wanted to celebrate this moment with all you here at the Clinic because you treated me like family."

Today, Francisco lives, works and raises his son in Minneapolis with all the rights and responsibilities accorded a U.S. citizen. He couldn't be more proud!

Our Response to the Urgent Needs of Immigrants and Refugees

During FY16-17, our Immigrant Circle of Justice program responded to the urgent needs of immigrants and refugees resulting from new immigration-related policies, executive orders, and laws. Our program addressed a full range of client needs, from empowerment to resolution, in the seven-county metro area and parts of Southern Minnesota. We have responded to what this community has faced:

Threat of Deportation

- → We provided weekly Know Your Rights presentations at the Mexican Consulate with an opportunity for each attendee to meet with an attorney. We also traveled with the Mexican Consulate throughout Minnesota with the "Consulados Moviles."
- Our immigration attorney was featured in a weekly Hispanic radio show, called "Charla Legal."
- → We provided legal education presentations through churches and community groups.
- → We conducted 13 Delegation of Parental Authority (DOPA) workshops, helping 200 parents complete 530 DOPAs, providing them with a legal plan for their children and assets in case of deportation.
- → We provided screening, legal advice, and legal services related to U-Visa, VAWA, and other possible immigration options available under the law.
- → We piloted our Resident to Citizenship Project at our Waite House Legal Clinic.

Expiration of Temporary Protected Status

We helped Liberians whose Temporary Protected Status expired in May understand the immigration options available to them at our communitybased clinic at Brooklyn United Methodist Church.

Travel Ban

→ We were available at our community-based legal clinics to answer questions regarding the travel ban.

Special Immigrant Juvenile Status

→ Our Journey of Hope program helped potential custodians of children who have crossed the border to obtain legal guardianship for these children. We also provided specialized risk screenings for potential custodians.

Hats Off to our Volunteers

During FY16-17, more than 700 people donated their time, and we needed them more than ever. These lawyers, paralegals, interpreters, clinic assistants and others provided 9,145 services to our clients. Each and every volunteer deserves recognition, but two in particular stood out last year to be honored at our annual Riverfront Celebration.



Stephen Rathke

Stephen Rathke, the 2017 Volunteer of the Year, is an exemplary criminal expungement and housing volunteer. He has been actively volunteering at VLN since 2015, working on more than 900 cases and donating more than a thousand hours. In 2016 alone. Steve volunteered 400 hours, providing 443 services. Steve's dedication to VLN and the clients we serve has no bounds. He rarely turns

down a case and is always willing to act as a mentor to other volunteers. In addition to his full-representation pro bono case load, Steve is a regular at the Housing Court Project clinic and volunteers at expungement seminars and clinics as needed.





The 2017 John D. Levine Distinguished Service Award went to long-time VLN supporter and volunteer Joseph T. Dixon, Jr., of Henson & Efron, P.A. Joe began volunteering for VLN in 1971, and his most recent area of concentration is in family law. For the past several years Joe has mostly provided advice and brief services. but records show that Joe used to take on many full-representation family law

cases - which as we all know, is an area of great need in our community, but produces high burn-out among volunteer attorneys. Considering that only a handful of volunteers have been providing pro bono direct representation for nearly 50 years, it is fitting for Joe to receive this year's VLN John Levine Distinguished Service Award.


688 attorneys took a case during FY16-17: 9,112 services were provided, including 6,106 received at clinics and events, and 1,591 received via telephone legal advice.


