

How to Call from a Restricted Number, and Make Conference Calls from your Cell Phone

To block your number from being displayed temporarily for a specific call:

1. Enter *67.
2. Enter the number you wish to call (including area code).
3. Tap Call. The words "Private," "Anonymous," or some other indicator will appear on the recipient's phone instead of your mobile number.

This works on both Android and iPhones.

How to start a conference call on an iPhone

1. Dial the first person and wait for the call to connect.
 2. Tap add call .
 3. Dial the second person, and wait for the call to connect.
 4. Tap merge calls .
 5. The two calls merge into a conference call. To add additional people, repeat steps 2-4. If you don't see the option to add another call, you might have reached the limit of participants for your carrier.

How to start a conference call on an Android phone

1. Start a phone call with one of the participants.
2. Tap "Add Call."
3. Call another participant. You will be brought back to the main screen of your Phone app. From here, place a call to the other person (or one of the other people) whom you want to include in the conference call.
4. You will now be in an active call with the new person (so your microphone will be unmuted), and your previous call will automatically be put on hold. If you want to talk to everyone you've called at the same time instead, tap the **Merge** button.
5. Add more callers, or manage the current ones. The caller information at the top of the screen should switch to say "Conference Call." If you want to (and can, in light of the limitations we listed above) add another person to the call, simply tap the **Add Call** button again and repeat steps 3 and 4. You can also tap the **Manage** button to take actions with the individual people in the conversation.
6. Press the "End Call" button to hang up once the call is over.
7. To disconnect yourself from the conference call, tap the red **End Call** button at the bottom of the screen. Note that this will not terminate the whole conference call; the other participants can still talk to each other until they hang up.
